Board Meeting Minutes of September 18, 2017

Board Meeting:

Meeting was called to order at 6:23 PM with a quorum present at Il Vicino in Downtown Colorado Springs, on September 18, 2017.

Board members in attendance:

Minutes: The minutes of the August 16, 2017, meeting were approved with annotations regarding the changing of the bank signatories from Margot Ardourel to

Board: Pattie Bowler suggested changing the Board's term to end in June instead of August. With the Ballot for Elections and the membership dues drive, splitting the two events into two meetings instead of one might work out better. In this way, we vote before the summer break and, when we start again in August, we start a fresh year instead of starting in a transitional mode. It is something we decided to bring up for consideration at a future membership meeting as it would require an amendment to the bylaws and entail a vote by ballot or a meeting of a quorum of two-thirds of the voting membership.

Treasurer's Report: John Martin gave an update to his progress taking over as Treasurer.

New Business: We spoke about Carolyn Ginter's bequest and how much we would give as donations/awards, what would be the conditions for qualification, and how often we would give awards to students. We will form an education/awards committee.

Pattie Bowler made a motion to establish a separate education account as we also collect donations through our membership form under the caption PPWS Education Program. We would use monies in this account for the benefit of Bemis School of Art, Bemis Wounded Warriors Program, and Pikes Peak Community

College in an amount of \$100 each. John seconded the motion, and it passed.

We need to remove Mary Taylor from our ENT account and add Nancy Neale as an additional signatory.

Mary Piche suggested we nail down a PPWS budget, including Members' Show and Watermedia Exhibition budgets beforehand and total operating budget, to begin cleaning up years of the lack of proper documentation. John will ask during the general meeting if we want to form a budget committee.

Nancy suggested an art supply auction as a program, selling supplies you don't want or need with proceeds going to PPWS.

Pattie suggested having a white elephantstyle painting swap at our December holiday potluck meeting.

Nancy will pass around a suggestion sheet for ideas for future meetings, including the possibility of changing the meeting format and introducing new interactive ideas to stir excitement and membership participation.

Mary brought up sending new members/ guests a card or letter welcoming them to the PPWS, which would add a personal touch for our fellow artists and new members helping to foster engagement and repeat attendance.

Mary also suggested providing write-on sticker name tags for visitors, guests and members who forgot or lost their tags so that everyone knows everyone's names.

Nancy suggested goodie bags from vendors to pass out at future meetings as well as for possible door prizes. This could include a gift card from Meininger Art Materials as a thank you to volunteers. She believes that these are gestures that go far in making members feel more inclusive and volunteers more appreciated.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 PM.

Guests: There were no guests in attendance.

Barb and Jean talked about ideas for revamping the social time. We will have a suggestion/theme sheet for future meetings, such as a taco bar, chili night, or salad bar so people know the theme of the next meeting's social and the chefs can bring the food accordingly. Budget is \$100, not including wine, plates, etc. We want two people as chefs for each meeting as well as two hosts.

Minutes: August General Meeting Minutes were approved as they appeared in the September 2017 newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: John Martin, Treasurer, presented the Treasurer's Report balances.

Nancy asked the membership about forming a committee for student scholarships. John Martin, Karen Standridge, Cathleen Savage and Judith Swanson volunteered.

We may still be able to utilize Library 21c, but need suggestions and leg work put into securing other venues. The new Ent Art Center on N. Nevada might be a possibility as well as the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center, which is now merged with Colorado College.

Members' Show: Nancy said that we will not plan a year-end Members' Show, especially that we've already had a Members' Show at Library 21c during this past summer and that it is already too late to plan for it and find a venue. She suggested perhaps alternating years for our Members' Show and International Watermedia.

Library: Myra Patin gave us an update on the library. She would like to hear from you as to which DVD titles you would like added to the library in order for her to take advantage of upcoming seasonal sales.

Judy Swanson brought in a big bag of Watercolor Artist magazines.

Old Business: Congratulations to the winner of the "workshop for a new member of two years or less" for September, Mary Jane Snyder.

There is a waiting list for the guest wall at Boulder Street Gallery according to Myra Patin.

Sam Newcomb is the contact for name tags, new or replacement.

Kang Lee Sheppard again mentioned Sheppard Arts Institute classes, thanking Don Van Horn for teaching.

New Business: Nancy asked for suggestions and feedback for meeting ideas and structure. All feedback is welcome.

Nancy brought up ideas for our December meeting. We could have a white-elephant type gift exchange with matted, small original paintings. Another idea was making and exchanging artist trading cards.

We will also have an auction for used or unloved art supplies, perfect for the February meeting. Myra will be auctioneer. Proceeds might go toward our educational fund, operating costs, and/or getting a camera to plug into Catalyst's projection system for our artist demos. At this meeting, Reveille will also hold the auction for the beautiful painting Joe Beckner gifted to PPWS.

Reveille attended a talk at Ivywild School regarding the arts. In both El Paso and Teller counties, art sales bring in over \$153 million each year, and it's a huge oversight that the city thinks of art as "fluff." She wanted to bring this to everyone's attention so that hopefully we can be a vehicle for change in the future.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:07 PM.


October Program:

Exercises: permission to play, creative process, use of horrible paper, quick studies, oversize brushes, value studies, masking, spraying, freedom to make a mess, splattering




