Colorado artist and native, **Tom Lockhart**, was born and raised in the heart of the San Luis Valley of southern Colorado. He grew up in the small rural farming community of Monte Vista and presently lives in Canon City. He has been painting professionally for over thirty years. He is a Signature Member of the Northwest Rendezvous, Oil Painters of America, Rocky Mountain Plein Air Painters, The Outdoor Painters Society and Landscape Artists International.

As a diversified artist, working and selling in three mediums, oils, pastels and watercolors, Tom has recently won awards in The Colorado Watercolor Society State Exhibition, the Southwestern Colorado Watercolor Exhibition, The Pikes Peak Pastel Society, and Best of Show for the Paint the Town Plein-Air Event. He participates in many outdoor plein-air painting events and has won numerous awards including Best of Show in four events in Colorado in 2011. Among his recognitions, too numerous to list, were featured covers on art magazines and National Arts for the Parks awards.

Tom continually strives to convey a feeling of light and atmosphere in his paintings. He is looking for a balance between representation and impressionism. As a landscape painter, painting outdoors helps him to understand this process more easily. He likes how brush work and color can convey the essence of a scene without being literal. He constantly tries different surfaces, and various brushes, to help create the illusion of the subject. Atmosphere, the effect of temperature, the mood, the time of day, all play an important role. Most importantly, it is the ability as a landscape painter to convey those sensations to the viewer.

"We as painters are illusionists; we are creating the illusion of depth, light, and atmosphere within a flat two-dimensional space." Tom feels that texture, variation of paint application, value, solid design and drawing make for a stronger presentation. As a landscape painter, he is constantly striving to apply these tools, so that he may arrive at a clearer understanding of his intended purpose.
